

FIRST.

I would meet with the Community, to check what their needs are, and determine what they want.

Do they need this kind of water, salt, drying, electricity, and transport via tricycles?

Do they need jobs?

If the Community DOES NOT want this kind of project, it is NEVER desired to force it upon them.

We go to another Community to find out.

If the Community WANTS the project, then, the NEXT step is to determine whom they want to lead the Community.

The Leader will need a Community to own the Project, without doubt.

A Community member will want to personally lay down a commitment.

SECOND.

Go through the PROCESS of DETERMINING how the Community will WANT to proceed.

This "HOW" is accompanied by volunteers for specific TASKS.

It is now our REPONSIBILITY to make it absolutely CLEAR what the tasks entail, their usual time-frame, the relationships between each of the tasks.

During the discussions with the Community, it would be DESIREABLE to understand what the tasks need (INPUTS), and the OUTPUTS of each task.
Understanding the timeliness will make the participants happier than ever.

Our GOAL would be to understand that each PARTICIPANT will want to ENVISION his/her SIGNATURE in the Project, as it is COMPLETED by GIVING of themselves.

THIRD.

As the Community nears the completion of each of the subsystems, those who work on it would be LOOKING FORWARD to writing the PROCEDURES that the Operating Personnel will need to UNDERTAKE.

The people that are PART of the Project are NOW fully IMMERSED in the NEW JOBS CREATED

They will not need EXTERNAL entities and so-called "experts" to TELL them WHAT to do, and what NOT to do.

One of the SUCCESSES that the Project BRINGS is the DEVELOPMENT of SELF-CONFIDENCE, the UNLEASHING of the Community's MOTIVATION, people who have BUILT their OWN DRIVE towards SHARING.
